Council 554 Round Table Project for St. Mary, St. Joseph and St. Barbara Churches

The Knights of Columbus Round Table initiative is meant to have knights who have a home corporation to support and bring the Order's charity work back into their local parishes. Members of Massillon Council 554 actively participate in their parish ministries and on occasions, provided service to our pastors when requested. But the knights of Council 554 have developed a new project that provides spiritual growth in our Catholic Faith.

Beginning this August, the Council 554 members will be conducting the Divine Mercy Chaplet recitation once a month in our parishes. Our Lord said through his apparitions to St. Faustina "It pleases me to grant everything souls ask of me by saying the chaplet." The chaplet should be said during the 3:00 hour, for all of us who need His divine mercy.

This Round Table Program will be under the supervision of our three Round Table Coordinators: Tom Ferrero (St. Joseph), Ken Girt (St. Mary) and Joe Vilhosky (St. Barbara)

The following schedule will list the days, time and location for each parish:

St Joseph Third Friday of the Month, 3:00 PM, in the church following the Blessed Sacrament Exposition which runs from 9:00 AM thru 3:00 PM. (Please Note: until the repair work in church is completed, these events will be held in the chapel in the parish center (former convent).

St. Mary First Tuesday of the Month, 3:30 PM, in the chapel in the parish center on 1st Street. The recitation of the chaplet will be said prior to the regular Tuesday Mass for St. Dymphna at 4:00 PM.

St Barbara Fourth Tuesday of the Month, 3:00 PM, in the church.

The Divine Mercy Chaplet is recited using a rosary. To learn more about the recitation, tune into EWTN every afternoon at 3:00 for the recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet, with music.



The Chaplet of The Divine Mercy

How to Recite the Chaplet

The Chaplet of Mercy is recited using ordinary rosary beads of five decades. The Chaplet is preceded by two opening prayers from the Diary of Saint Faustina and followed by a closing prayer.



1. Make the Sign of the Cross

2. Optional Opening Prayers

You expired, Jesus, but the source of life gushed forth for souls, and the ocean of mercy opened up for the whole world. O Fount of Life, unfathomable Divine Mercy, envelop the whole world and empty Yourself out upon us.

(Repeat three times)

O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of Mercy for us, I trust in You!

3. Our Father

4. Hail Mary

5. The Apostle's Creed

6. The Eternal Father

Eternal Father, I offer you the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Your Dearly Beloved Son, Our Lord, Jesus Christ, in atonement for our sins and those of the whole world.

7. On the Ten Small Beads of Each Decade

For the sake of His sorrowful Passion, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

8. Repeat for the remaining decades

Saying the "Eternal Father" (6) on the "Our Father" bead and then 10 "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion" (7) on the following "Hail Mary" beads.

9. Conclude with Holy God (Repeat three times)

Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

10. Optional Closing Prayer

Eternal God, in whom mercy is endless and the treasury of compassion — inexhaustible, look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your holy will, which is Love and Mercy itself.
