He graduated from the University of Akron with a Bachelor of Science degree in Physics where he met his wife Judy. Richard worked at General Tire which was later Continental in various engineering and administrative positions before retiring after 32 years. He then worked for Quick Draft and then was a self-employed engineering consultant. As a member of St. Joseph he maintained the church bells, did Holy Name Donut Sunday, leader of prayer also serving at the Laurels of Massillon, was VP of Holy Name Society, a Lector, Eucharistic Minister, a volunteer for bingo and lastly an active member of the Right to Life Movement participating in many years of marches in Washington, DC. Richard a member of the Knights of Columbus #554 and a 4th Degree member served as Grand Knight and Treasurer. He helped work on the original construction of our K of C Building and then the recent renovations. He assisted with many projects at the K of C and volunteered his time working bingo.
