Religious of the Year - Deacon Randy Smith

Deacon Randy Smith is a 4th Degree Knight and has been married for 30 years to Leeann. He was past Grand Knight for council 554, as well as past Faithful Navigator, and past Chapter President. He is first Deacon in DOY to be appointed a Spiritual Advisor for a KofC Council where he serves in the position for Holy Family Council and Massillon Squires. He has been involved in youth ministry for 27 years. He was appointed DRE at St. Joseph 7 years ago. He oversees programs from story time with toddlers through children's faith formation and youth ministry to adult faith formation. He is in charge of RCIA, head of Liturgy Committee and trains servers, Eucharistic Ministers and lectors. He is the parish coordinator for the Community Candlelight Walk. He also spent 11 years as cemetery sexton and is still the administrator of the cemetery office. He has led yearly mission trips to Kentucky and Cincinnati and has been doing this for six years. He was invited to lead a prayer service at the Greater Mount Sinai Baptist Church, which was a great lesson for the kids about evangelizing.

Deacon Randy was ordained to the Diaconate in September 2013, and appointed Associate Vocation Director for the Youngstown Diocese in 2014. He makes school visits to speak about religious vocations as well as the importance of discerning any vocation, such as marriage or single life. He works in the area of seminarian development, retreats, in conjunction with the youth mission trips. He also serves as MC for Bishop Murry. He is a member of the Diocesan Youth Convention planning team, served as a judge for the Eagle of the Cross award and has been the master of ceremonies for Catholic Men's Fellowship Conference. Outside of St. Joseph Parish, he works with Campus Ministry at Walsh and leads retreats at our Catholic high schools. He is a board member of One Community/No Hunger and participates in after-school programs for at-risk youths.

Chaplain of the Year - Msgr James Kolp

Msgr Kolp is a 4th Degree Knight. He was also Ohio State Chaplain for the Knights of Columbus twice 1969-1970 & 1989-1991. He was Chaplain for the Boy Scouts for the Diocese of Youngstown from 1966 - 1997. He is also an Eagle Scout. He was ordained April 29, 1950 and was the Pastor at St. Mary's Massillon from 1973 - 2000. Msgr Kolp at 93, is still very active in saying Mass, funerals, weddings and Baptisms at more than 40 different parishes in Ohio, Kentucky and Florida. He is very active in the Right to Life March in Washington DC and has been attending the march for 42 years.

Msgr Kolp has written two books, his first "The Amazing Father Lindesmith", published in 2004 and "Chaplain and a Half" published in 2015. It is the life of Fr. Robert Earl Brengartner, a military chaplain in three wars. He is already working on a third book about the Rev. Edward Vattman, who was a pastor in Canal Fulton for several years.

Music has always been an important part of monsignor's life, in addition to playing the organ, he plays the piano, the Harmonica and the bugle. He also finds time occasionally to help with our Hot Lunch program. He is also our Chaplain to council 554 and an inspiration to us all.

Blue Coat of the Year - Sergeant Josh Edwards

This award goes to the dedicated person who goes beyond the call of duty for his community. Sergeant Josh Edwards is a Sergeant with the Massillon Police Department and has served there since 2010. After 4 years with the US Army, he received a Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice. He is a dedicated family man living with his wife Dayna, and four children in Dalton. He believes in service to the community. He has helped many residents deal with day to day difficulties of life. He is known for repeatedly doing things

like personally purchasing diapers for a mother he caught shoplifting or sharing a meal with someone needing food. He has volunteered with the "Shop with a Cop" program whereby underprivileged children spend time shopping with a policeman.

On November 16, 2017, a call came in of a possible suicidal male. The young man, who had a history of suicidal tendencies, made statements that he was going to a bridge and hang himself. Unfortunately calls such as these are not uncommon. Josh responded to the area where the male was said to have gone and coordinated with patrol units in the area to attempt at locating him. While searching the area, he saw the young man sitting on the edge of a historical bridge located at Oak Knoll Park. He quickly parked his police truck underneath the bridge in an attempt to hinder the man's ability to jump. This quick decision undoubtedly slowed the man's decision to jump. Josh was able to coordinate the other patrol officers to get into place, he was then able to engage the man verbally. Another officer and he were at that point able to grab the man from harm and was instead given help. Afterwards, the Josh commented on how lucky he was to have been in the right place at the right time to see the man as he drove by. He heard the call, hit the road and kept his eyes open for a citizen in need. He did this because it is not only what good officers do, but also what good Leaders do.

Volunteer of the Year - Mark Hoffer

Mark Hoffer is a 3rd Degree Knight and is married to Deanna. They have four children who are all dedicated servants of St. Mary's Church. He is an active Sunday Lector and usher at St. Mary's for the past 10 years and first to fill in when needed; he even purchased a new lectionary for all the lectors to use. He has been a CCD instructor since 2017 and can be found working at all the CCD fundraiser rummage sales and various annual special dinners. He is an extraordinary sacristan of sorts, volunteering for special projects to enhance Fr. Gretchko's Mass attire. He offers his skills with information technology either at the soundboard for Mass, troubleshooting an array of PC, internet, phone system, security system, software, and hardware problems, whenever they may arise. He and his family volunteer on our St. Mary's Round Table projects. Each spring, summer and fall he and his entire family joyfully volunteer together to serve the beautification needs of St. Mary's parish. He is an almost daily volunteer at St. Vincent de Paul, food pantry located at St. Mary's parish. He helps wherever necessary whether it is packing food, stocking shelves, unloading Thursday's truck, or making palettes - all before he reports to his regular job. Through St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP) he served at the Akron Canton Regional Foodbank's Operation Orange, sorting and packing onions with his three children at his side. He and his family were involved in St. Mary's SVdP Christmas food giveaway, loading carts and distributing food.

Mark is a proud Boy Scout and Cub Scout father. He supports St. Joan of Arc Boy Scout Troop #939 and Otterbein United Methodist Cub Scouts Pack #264. He and his wife organize and manage a Scout Day Camp for one week each Summer. He has always been ready to help out whether it is for St. Mary's, the K of C, or the Massillon Community. He is a friend to many and a devoted family man. Our council is grateful for his service.

Humanitarian of the Year - Rob Lautenschleger
