NEW Exemplification of Charity, Unity and Fraternity

New Haven, CT. On November 23, 2019, the Board of Directors of the Knights of Columbus - Supreme Council approved a new combined ceremonial to be used by all Knights of Columbus Councils. This new ceremonial; *Exemplification of Charity, Unity and Fraternity*, allows all 3 degrees to be conferred in a single ceremony.

Massillon, OH. The officers and trustees of Massillon Council 554 have whole-heartedly adopted this new degree concept and will sponsor the *Exemplification of Charity, Unity and Fraternity* at the Massillon Knights Hall on Sunday, February 23, at 2:00 PM. 


