Michael McGivney, our founder, was an assistant priest. Fr. McGivney had a great devotion to Our Blessed Mother.

As we honor Our Lady during this month of May, it is good to remember that our Order continues to have a great love for Our Lady. For example, during World Wars I and II our Order sent tens of thousands of rosaries to our troops. We also honor Our Lady under the title of Our lady of Guadalupe.

Something very special will occur on Wednesday, May 31 to honor Our Blessed Lady. Our Council is sponsoring the Silver Rose Program at St. Mary Church at 7:00 P.M. The program shows our commitment that we are people of life and for life.

I urge all of you to be present on Wednesday, May 31 at St. Mary's. Bring your rosary and bring your family so that we can show Our Lady that we are truly pro-life in every way.

Silver Rose Program

Since 1960, the **Silver Rose program**, has gathered Knights and Columbian Squires from Mexico, the United States and Canada under the mantle of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Patroness of the Americas. In the mid-1990s, it was adopted as a Supreme Council initiative, which grew to encompass multiple pilgrimage routes and reaffirm the Order's commitment to the sanctity of human life.

One of these Silver Roses will be traveling thru our diocese at the end of May. The Knights of Columbus Stark Chapter and Fr Ed Gretchko, pastor of St. Mary Church will be conducting the Silver Rose Program, on Wednesday, May 31 at 7:00 PM in St. Mary Church All members of Council 554 and their families are welcomed to attend. The service is also open to area Catholics who believe in the sanctity of Human Life.


