Chaplain's Report, by Msgr. James Kolp, Chaplain

During times of crisis Christ sends saints. In the early 19th century in the wake of the French Revolution, He sent Jean Vianney whose witness of love and humility rekindled the faith of thousands as they flocked to his tiny parish in Ars, France. I had the privilege of visiting Ars some years ago. I have a relic of St. John Vianney.

Thousands again flocked to the holy Cure of Ars this past year in the wake of the sexual abuse crisis affecting the Church. This time they encountered the incorrupt heart of the patron saint of parish priests as it crisscrossed the United States in the care of the Knights of Columbus. The "Heart of a Priest" tour, as it was called, passed through all 48 states. More than 380,000 pilgrims prayed for the Church and her shepherds.

St. John Vianney had a great love for Our Lady from the time he was in the cradle. As a priest he exerted all his energy in spreading her glory.

October is the month of the holy Rosary of Our Lady. I urge you to pray the Rosary daily during this time. Come to our Council Meeting on Tuesday, October 8th. Bring your Rosary. We will pray part of the Rosary at the conclusion of the meeting. Like St. John Vianney let us love the Rosary and pray it with great devotion. And let us place our beloved Bishop Murry at the center of our prayers.

There may be more distributors of the new uniform soon which could possibly bring the cost of the uniform down. This would be great as we need more Sir Knights available in the new uniform.

The following lists the proposed changes to the Council 554 bylaws. Voting will take place at our regular meeting on October 8, 2019.

ARTICLE I

Section 2. Currently states: The initiation fee shall be 30.00. Revision will now state: \$15.

Section 3. **Currently states:** Each member shall pay annual dues. The dues shall be payable quarterly in advance at the first regular meetings in January, April, July and October. The annual dues of members shall be 30.00 except honorary members who shall pay the sum of State and Supreme Council per capita charges and levies, and honorary life members who shall pay nothing.

Section 3. **Revision will now state:** Each member shall pay annual dues. The dues shall be payable quarterly in advance at the first regular meetings in January, April, July and October. The annual dues of members shall be \$35 except honorary members and deacons who shall \$20, and honorary life members who shall pay nothing.

ARTICLE VI- Committees

- (c) Currently States; Director of Church Activities to promote a program that will enable the membership to respond to the constant call for the active participation of the laity in the work of the Church and putting our Catholic faith into action. Revision: Change "Church" to "Faith".
- (e) Currently States; Director of Council Activities who will be concerned with the promotion of brotherhood through athletic, cultural and social programs. Additionally, he will be responsible for the development of public relations in the council. **Revision:** Delete section to coincide with Faith in Action
- (f) Director of Youth Activities to provide the youth in the community with the means and the opportunity to become personally committed and involved in meeting the challenges of our times. He will also be responsible for the promotion of the Order's junior organization, the Columbian Squires. **Revision:** Delete section to coincide with Faith in Action
- (g) Director of Family Life Activities to promote activities and programs within the Council that would strengthen and support the family life of its members. **Revision:** Delete word "Life" to coincide with Faith in Action

Add to coincide with Faith in Action: (h) Director of LIFE Activities to promote programs to highlight our Order's support of human life in all stages.

ARTICLE VII- Funds

Section 3. **Currently States** No money in excess of 200.00 shall be paid or transferred from the Treasury of this Council, (except such moneys as the Council is called upon to regularly pay for its current expenses and as provided by the Laws and Rules of the Order or for purposes approved by the Supreme Council or Board of Directors), unless by a two/thirds vote of the members present and voting at a regular business meeting held subsequent to a regular business meeting at which notice in writing of a resolution of intention to pay or transfer such money and the purposes and amount to be paid or transferred shall have been given and regularly read. **Revision:** Change amount from \$200 to \$250.

ARTICLE VIII - Funerals, Etc

Add section: Section 3 Upon the death of a member in good standing, the council will provide up to \$30 for Masses to be said for the deceased member.
